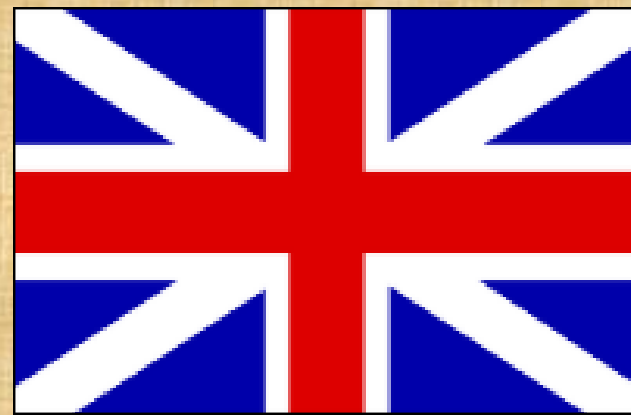
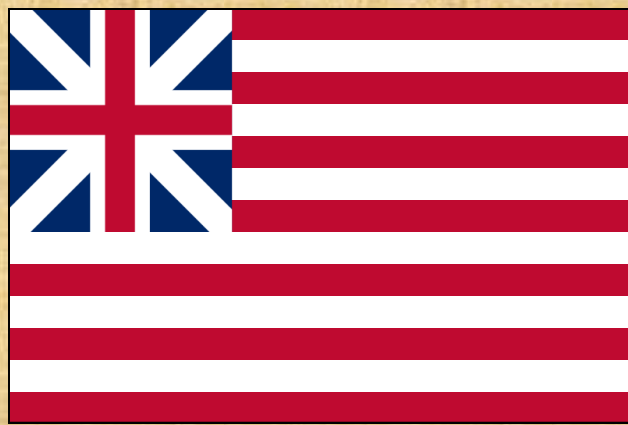
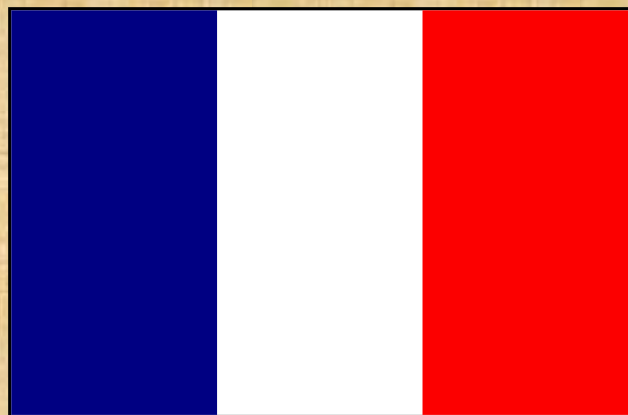


Camp Wilton On The James

For 10 days in May of 1781, General Marquis de Lafayette and over 900 troops made camp in the tobacco fields surrounding Wilton before the Siege of Yorktown. This weekend-long living history encampment will have several demonstrations of the military drill of the Continental Army. Walk through the camp and find out how soldiers –as well as campfollowers– ate, slept, and lived while on the march.
